The team was divided into 7 camps to reach out to 4 districts in the region of Karamoja. All of the camps had one common purpose, time table, and direction. On the way, one bus experienced a flat tire and another failed to reach their location, but these issues were easily fixed and everyone arrived safely! We were welcomed into our camps by the Karamojong missionaries on the ground, and started fellowshiping with one another. Divine Care Ministries has successfully raised leaders, committed to Christianity, which make our stay in Karamoja more comfortable. The existing churches and our sponsored children serve as our interpreters and help us share the Gospel. **Luke 9:6 says, “So they set out and went from village to village, proclaiming the good news and healing people everywhere.”**

We planted 7 new churches and got to see the fruit that came from that!

1. There is a need to break the cultural habit of marrying off girls at a tender age
2. There is a need to support leaders/missionaries who are willing to go back to Karamoja to train leaders and take care of church plants
3. There is need for ECDCs in the deep communities to equip the young generation and youth conferences
4. There is need for clean water, balanced climate conditions, raiding to stop, and poverty to decrease
